



### **Company Policy about Climbing on Top of Loaded Trailers**

Your safety is our top priority, and it simply is not safe for any driver to climb on top of any loaded trailer for any reason. There are unseen hazards and a high risk of falling into the load, or out of the trailer. There are no circumstances where your safety should be risked. It is the stated policy of Tiger Lines that no driver will get on top of the trailer to adjust the load for any reason. Such unsafe acts will receive disciplinary action.

In the event you are unable to properly tarp your load due to an obstruction, you should follow these procedures:

- First contact your Dispatcher to advise them of the situation. Depending on the circumstances, you will be directed to do one or more of the following:
  - Use a ladder or platform where you can reach into the load in a safe manner and attempt to knock down the obstruction.
  - If you are still not able to tarp the load, pull the trailer back into the loading site so the loader is able to correct the issue.
  - The final resolution if the tarp still cannot be pulled over the load is to pump off the load.

Your personal safety is the highest priority we all have, so please do not risk getting injured by climbing on top of a load. Following the above policy will keep you safe and avoid an injury that could be very serious.
